

# Helping CHWs demonstrate their impact through data collection systems

#### THE CHALLENGE

Graduates report transformational growth in their abilities as well as understanding their important community impact. While their work is meaningful and significant, there was no formal way of illustrating the positive effects of the training program. CHWAR sought to develop and implement an evaluation plan to better tell the story of their organization's impact.

# Establishing a systematic process of capturing data to tell the CHW story.

#### WHAT WE DID

- Created a logic model to capture a snapshot of the training program and intended outcomes.
- Developed an evaluation plan to define measurement and monitoring of program impact.
- Created a systematic data collection process, using online survey tools for English and Spanish language users.
- Presented compiled findings to CHWAR leaders, trainees, and other key stakeholders.
